Changes because of COVID

Starting on Dec. 12, Gardenside made some changes due to a few COVID cases begin diagnosed among our residents and high COVID, flu and RSV rates in our community. Currently, all staff and visitors are required to mask while in Gardenside.

While visitation is not restricted, we ask everyone not to visit if you have any symptoms of illness or are not feeling well. Those are visiting a resident who has been diagnosed with illness will need to wear personal protective equipment including gowns and masks (which we will provide.)

Residents are currently not sharing meals in the dining room, but are having meals delivered to their rooms. They can be out in the day room if they are masked, and we are limited this to a small number of residents at a time to strive to prevent passing any illnesses between residents. Guests are currently not able to share meals with our residents.


Our Christmas open house was postponed due to illness. We are planning to reschedule, and will let families know the new date.

Residents Enjoy Christmas Gifts


